

Exerpt from "The Dundas Valley Orchestra, A Jewel in the Valley: 1978-2011"

"After a couple of seasons, founding President Gordon Webster and his wife, Betty, instituted a Strawberries and Champagne Social which was held annually each June for several years at their home on Mineral Springs Road just outside of Dundas. The orchestra would play a concert of about thirty minutes to one hour and then the audience would be served champagne and strawberries with whipped cream. Among the artists invited to display and sell their work were ceramic artist Carol Rossman and graphic artist Sally Glanville and they contributed a portion of their proceeds to the orchestra. Dorothy Mould, Gordon's sister and a gifted artist, also displayed her work."
