DVO Time Machine An excerpt from "Players' personal memories" in "The Dundas Valley Orchestra, A Jewel in the Valley: 1978-2011"

Rick Nielsen (French horn)

Rick Nielsen has played with the DVO since its founding and spent a decade as the orchestra's librarian.

There are a million library stories but, in general, it is difficult to get music back from the members at the end of the season. They take it home and bring it back a year later and think that you will be pleased! I used to stand by the back door of St. Paul's Church after the concert and snatch the music folders from the "old guys" as they went out the door. Frank Tester, being very forgetful, was the "best" at this.

Once he had four years' worth of folders with music. I would telephone him and ask, but he would say, "No, I turned it in."

Then, one day, his mind cleared and he found the four folders, so he called Art Vogt (who had retired four years earlier!). Quick off the mark, Art jumped in his car and went over to Frank's to get them. Art understood how important they were to us.

I have played for over twenty years in the DVO and my favorite concert was Art Vogt's last concert. His son, Bruce, came from the University of Victoria, where he taught music, and the orchestra backed the beautiful Chopin piano Concerto #2. In spite of us, it was a wonderful performance.

With the music swirling through my head I went home and, that night, my old black Labrador dog died. I still cry when that music is played.
