Trillium Foundation grants the DVO \$13,500!

We have been awarded \$13,500 for the purchase of new timpani and percussion instruments by the Trillium Foundation of Ontario!

These funds will purchase a Snare Drum with stand, Crash Cymbals, a Glockenspiel with stand, a Xylophone with stand, a Cymbal, and three copper Timpani with folding stands for easy transport.

The addition of these instruments will greatly enhance our ability to provide a wider repertoire of music.






Only four left from our original printing
